

NJ Town Receives World Trade Center Artifact

Lt. Gov. Kim Guadagno has presented what she says is the largest piece of steel in the state of New Jersey to come from the former World Trade Center. Guadagno presented the 13-foot, 1,300-pound mangled piece of steel to Evesham Township on Friday. Evesham Mayor Randy Brown tells the Burlington County Times that the artifact will anchor the township's Sept. 11 memorial, which they plan to complete by next spring or summer. Guadagno says the memorial will help honor the hundreds of victims of the Sept. 11, 2001 terrorist attacks, including Evesham resident LeRoy Homer, the first officer of Flight 93. Dozens of firefighters, police officers and emergency personnel attended the presentation of the steel artifact.
