

WORLD TRADE CENTER BEAM PART OF ILLINOIS MEMORIAL

SPRINGFIELD, Ill. — A large piece of steel from the World Trade Center is now part of a memorial at Illinois State Police headquarters in Springfield.

The State Journal-Register reports (<http://bit.ly/sIADIf>) it took about four months for police to obtain the 115-pound piece from New York. It was unveiled last week. The I-beam measures 27 inches by 12 inches. Illinois State Police employee Keith Schroeder built a plaque and a stand to support the beam from the attacks on Sept. 11, 2001.
