

# One World Trade Center Observatory To Open In May

Soon visitors will be able to travel to the top of the tallest building in the USA in just 60 seconds.

The observatory at the top of the One World Trade Center will open to the public May 29. The observatory is on the top three floors of the building and is 1,250 feet in the air.

The resurrected World Trade Center opened its doors for business in November — 13 years after the 9/11 terror attacks.

Tickets for the observatory will be available online starting April 8.

The observatory is offering free admission to 9/11 family members and the rescue and recovery workers who responded to the terror attacks on Sept. 11 and the months after.

Admission varies, with \$32 tickets for ages 13-64, \$26 for ages 6-12, and \$30 for those 65 and older.
