ADDENDUM # 1

To prospective Bidder(s) on Bid # 46298: “Snow Removal from Aeronautical Operations Areas at John F. Kennedy International Airport - Three (3) Year Requirements Contract,”

Now Due back on 6/28/2016, no later than 11:00AM:

I. CHANGES/MODIFICATIONS

The following changes/modifications are hereby made to the solicitation documents:

A. The bid due date is extended to June 28, 2016 no later than 11:00AM.

B. Part III, Section 5 “Liquidated Damages”:

Delete paragraph “iv)” in its entirety and replace it with the following:

“If equipment is unavailable or unusable when needed for the performance of Work, or if equipment fails during the performance of services and is not repaired or replaced within one hour of incident, then the compensation payable by the Port Authority to the Contractor will be reduced by an amount equal to the product obtained by multiplying 200% of the Unit Price or Hourly Rate for each piece of unusable equipment by the number of hours or fraction thereof during which the required equipment is unavailable or unusable.”

C. Part IV - Pricing Sheets:

Delete the Pricing Sheets for Supplemental Work (pages 6, 8 and 10) in their entirety and replace them with the attached revised pages labeled “Revised 6/21/2016”.

D. Part V - Specifications:

a) Section 1 entitled “Specific Definitions”: Delete the definition of “Clearance of Snow” or “Snow Removal” in its entirety and replace it with the following:

“ “Clearance of Snow” or “Snow Removal” means the removal of accumulated snow, slush or hail, and performance of deicing services, to the satisfaction of the Manager.”

- b) Section 2 entitled “Work Required by the Specifications”: Delete the second sentence of the first paragraph and replace it with the following:
“The Contractor shall provide the equipment specified herein for the performance of Work at no additional cost to the Port Authority.”
- c) Section 2 entitled “Work Required by the Specifications”: Add the following as the third sentence of the last paragraph to this Section:
“Sodium acetate will be supplied by the Port Authority to the Contractor at no cost to the Contractor.”
- d) Section 2 entitled “Work Required by the Specifications”: Add the following as the final sentence of the last paragraph to this Section:
“The Port Authority will allow the Contractor to fuel its vehicles and equipment while performing Work at the Facility at no cost to the Port Authority.”
- e) Section 4 entitled “Personnel Requirements”: Delete the last sentence of the first paragraph and replace it with the following:
“It is the Contractor’s responsibility to determine if any of its vehicles require the operators to have CDL licenses, with Medical Examiner’s Certificate, to operate such equipment, and the Contractor is responsible for obtaining the licenses.”
- f) Section 7 entitled “Communications Device”: Delete this Section in its entirety and replace it with the following:
“The Contractor shall provide to all employees under this Contract a cellular phone as approved by the Port Authority for use at the Facility while Work is being performed to ensure constant communications between the Contractor’s employees and the Manager. All costs associated with communications devices shall be borne by the Contractor and shall not be separately billable to the Port Authority. The Contractor shall provide all cellular phone numbers to the Manager prior to the start of the Contract and each Snow Season and immediately as phone numbers change.”
- g) Section 10 entitled “GPS Tracking System Requirements”: Add the following as the last sentence to this Section:
“The Contractor shall provide the Manager access to the GPS tracking system for tracking and reporting purposes.”
- h) Section 11 entitled “Space Provided to the Contractor”: Delete the second paragraph in its entirety and replace it with the following:
“For times during the term of this Contract which are not in the Snow Season, the space provided to the Contractor during the Snow Season will remain available for storage of heavy equipment and vehicles. However, no additional space is guaranteed during the offseason.”

- i) Section 10 entitled “Space Provided to the Contractor”: Add the following as the last paragraph to this Section:
 “Storage space shall not be used for repairs or other activities of the Contractor. Parking space will be provided to the Contractor for its employees while they are performing Work under this Contract.”

II. BIDDER'S QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

The following information is available in response to questions submitted by prospective Bidders. The responses should not be deemed to answer all questions which have been submitted by Bidders to the Port Authority. It addresses only those questions which the Port Authority has deemed to require additional information and/or clarification. The fact that information has not been supplied with respect to particular questions asked by Bidders does not mean or imply, nor should it be deemed to mean or imply, any meaning, construction, or implication with respect to the terms.

The Port Authority makes no representations, warranties or guarantees that the information contained herein is accurate, complete or timely or that such information accurately represents the conditions that would be encountered during the performance of the Contract. The furnishing of such information by the Port Authority shall not create or be deemed to create any obligation or liability upon it for any reason whatsoever and each Bidder, by submitting its Bid, expressly agrees that it has not relied upon the foregoing information, and that it shall not hold the Port Authority liable or responsible therefor in any manner whatsoever. Accordingly, nothing contained herein and no representation, statement or promise, of the Port Authority, its Commissioners, officers, agents, representatives, or employees, whether made orally or in writing, shall impair or limit the effect of the warranties of the Bidder required by this Bid or Contract and the Bidder agrees that it shall not hold the Port Authority liable or responsible therefor in any manner whatsoever.

The Questions and Answers numbering sequence will be continued sequentially in any forthcoming Addenda that may be issued.

Question #1	During the offseason, will the Contractor be required to move its equipment?
Answer #1	No. See modification D h).
Question #2	If both contracts (Bid #46297 for non-aeronautical public areas and Bid # 46298 for aeronautical operations areas) are awarded to the same Contractor, will a separate trailer for staging personnel be permitted for each location?
Answer #2	No.
Question #3	Is there separate pricing for snow laborers, hand shovelers and snow blowers?

Answer #3	No.
Question #4	What deicing materials are required, and will the Port Authority supply the materials?
Answer #4	See above modification D c).
Question #5	Will the Port Authority allow the Contractor to fuel its vehicles and equipment during operations at the Facility?
Answer #5	See above modification D d).
Question #6	Will parking space be provided to the Contractor for it employees performing work?
Answer #6	See above modification D i).
Question #7	Does the GPS apply to all pieces of equipment, or just vehicles?
Answer #7	Refer to Part V Section 10 entitled "GPS Tracking System Requirements"
Question #8	Does the Contractor have to furnish a GPS monitoring system to the Port Authority? Most GPS systems work off a website.
Answer #8	No. See above modification D g).
Question #9	Will the current contract pricing sheets be made available?
Answer #9	See attached.
Question #10	In Part III, it states that the Contractor is compensated for each 1/10 th of an inch of snow removed. Please confirm that "snow removed" shall be defined as all snowfall accumulations as recorded at JFK according to the NOAA.
Answer #10	Refer to Specifications Section 2 entitled "Work Required by the Specifications".
Question #11	When there is no more removal of snow required, will the Port Authority release the Contractor and its equipment from standby mode at the Facility?
Answer #11	No. The release of the Contractor and its equipment will be at the discretion of the Manager.
Question #12	For Liquidated Damage iv, if any piece of equipment not repaired or replaced is no longer needed due to removal services ending, would damages continue to be assessed?
Answer #12	See above modification B.
Question #13	Does the Contractor determine when activation begins?
Answer #13	Refer to Specifications Section 3 entitled "Activation of Contractor".

Question #14	Is a CDL license required?
Answer #14	See above modification D e).
Question #15	All operators must have cell phone or communications device. Is there a specific system required?
Answer #15	No. See above modification D f).
Question #16	Please confirm that Supervisors are required to have the annual SIDA IDs, and not just Port Authority Snow IDs.
Answer #16	Refer to Part V Section 6 entitled "Airport Security Identification Card Requirements".
Question #17	Is a trailer for staging personnel permitted airside where equipment is staged?
Answer #17	Yes, portable trailers as approved by the Manager are permitted.
Question #18	There is no Bobcat-type Skid Steer Loader or a Compact Loader listed in the Pricing Sheets for Supplemental Work. Shouldn't both pieces of equipment be included?
Answer #18	See above modification C.
Question #19	Area B requires a tow behind center line broom. Can the Contractor substitute a broom equivalent?
Answer #19	Yes, as approved by the Manager.
Question #20	Is a map of JFK available?
Answer #20	See attached.
Question #21	Will the attendance sheet form the Facility Inspection meeting be made available?
Answer #21	See attached.
