Estimate Range \$80M - \$90M. **Bids Due Thursday, January 10, 2019.** The work under this contract consists generally of priority steel repairs of the upper level orthotropic deck panels, replacement of upper level deck finger joints, installation of intelligent transportation system devices, and related work at the upper level main span and the approach roadways of the George Washington Bridge and the vicinities thereof in New York and New Jersey.  - a. That the bidder has a minimum of ten (10) years construction experience and has completed (or substantially completed) as a prime or general contractor at least three (3) contracts of comparable size, type and complexity to the work of this Contract.
 - b. That the bidder has a minimum of ten (10) years of experience coordinating and managing work in an urban, highly congested area, subject to high traffic volume requiring extensive maintenance of traffic.
 - c. That the bidder's full-time Project Manager and full-time Superintendent each have a minimum of ten (10) years construction experience on contracts comparable in size, type and complexity to the work of this Contract.
