

THE PORT AUTHORITY OF NY & NJ OCTOBER 2012 TRAFFIC REPORT

Aviation Department

SWF continues to experience passenger attrition, as October passenger traffic fell nearly 33%, pushing the YTD level down 9.8%. Contributing factors included the following: Hurricane Sandy and Delta's reduced seat capacity to Detroit as well as its complete elimination of service to its Atlanta hub. More importantly, JetBlue, the No. 1 carrier at the airport, switched from 158-seat A320s to smaller 100-seat regional jets for flights to Fort Lauderdale and Orlando. This led to a decline of 33%, or 3,100 fewer departing seats on these routes.
