

Progress

During the first half of the year, crews began installing precast concrete segments for the new northbound roadway, strengthening the steel at the Main Span arch, and building the elevated steel deck that will carry the new Main Span roadway, all in preparation to achieve Navigational Clearance, by late 2017.

Project Progress:

- ▶ Overall Project Completion 50%
- ▶ Northbound Approach Roadway Fabrication 77%
- ▶ Southbound Approach Roadway Fabrication 29%
- ▶ Main Span Roadway Steel Framing Installation 45%

Project Timeline:

- ▶ Achieve Navigational Clearance 2017
- ▶ All Lanes Operational 2019

Construction Update

Construction of the building that will house all of the electrical and plumbing needs for the bridge is nearing completion.

- ▶ The Residential Assistance Air Conditioning Reimbursement Program, Power Washing Program, Pool Cover Reimbursement Program, and Pool Cleaning Program resumed in May.
- ▶ We are currently accepting applications for the Window Replacement Program and the Hotel Stay Program. To date, 62 residents in Bayonne and 48 residents on Staten Island have utilized the Window Replacement Program.
