## The Risks of Piggybacking

**Definition:** An authorized individual allows/helps an unauthorized individual to enter a restricted area of the airport. Piggybacking is a serious violation that can lead to a Breach of Rules (BOR) and/or TSA civil penalties.

### What are the risks of Piggybacking?

- **Compromises Security:** Allows unauthorized access to secure areas.
- **Potential for Theft or Damage:** Unauthorized individuals may steal or damage property.
- **Personal Safety:** Increases the risk of personal harm to individuals.

## How to Prevent Piggybacking

- **Be Vigilant:** Always be aware of your surroundings when entering or exiting a secure area.
- **Use Access Control Correctly:** Ensure your Airport Security ID Card or key is used properly and the door fully closes behind you.
- **Challenge Unknown Individuals:** Challenge anyone who attempts to follow you without proper credentials or without properly using their Airport Security ID Card or key.
- **Report Suspicious Behavior:** Report any suspicious activity or individuals to security personnel immediately.
- **Remember:** Security is everyone's responsibility. By following these guidelines, you can help maintain a safe and secure environment for all.
