Call to order & Welcome:

Chairperson Barbara Brown called the meeting to order at 7:10 PM. We met at Jamaica Chamber of Commerce building; located at 157-11 Rockaway Blvd., Jamaica, NY 11434.

Introductions: All present representatives introduced themselves and what official or entity they represented. Including guests from the FAA and Port Authority. A quorum was present.

Minutes: The minutes from the June 4, 2018 meeting were presented for adoption. Motion made by Tom Curry and seconded by Jim Heyliger. Two corrections were suggested and accepted. Minutes were approved by a voice vote.

Flight Patterns at JFK International Airport:

- Chairperson Barbara Brown introduced Jeffrey Brooks, Operations Manager at TRACCON.
- Mr. Brooks proceeded with a PowePoint presentation on flight patterns at JFK (slide presentation to be made available.)
- A question and answer period followed.

Part 150 JFK Subcommittee Report by Dan Mundy, Chairperson:

- Dan made a motion to request that the Port Authority of NY/NJ conduct a Part 160 study to address the committees request for a curfew and or restrictions on night flights at JFK International Airport.
- Motion to adopt was made by Dan Mundy, seconded by Tom Curry. Questions on the motion followed.
- Mr. Hoppenhauer asked, "what is a Part 161 Study?" Andrew Brooks, Environmental Program Manager of the FAA gave a short response. In attempt to summarize his comments; he said that the study is done at a request for a noise and access restriction at an airport. The request must be initiated by the airport sponsor (PANYNJ). The History date back to year 1990. If you accept FAA funds for an airport, the airport is to always be available for air traffic. However, it was realized that circumstances may make restrictions on availability plausible and the 161 Study process was established. The study takes years; and he thinks it is paid for by the airport sponsor.
- Bill Huisman provided a clarification of the situation at LaGuardia Airport. Many times, people
 say that LGA has a voluntary curfew on flights from 11 PM to 6 AM. It is not a curfew, but rather
 a restriction. The use of restriction is accurate because the runways are restricted for use for
 runway maintenance.
- Vote was moved, and passed with 23-Yes, 0-No, 0-Abstentions.
- Barbara Brown presided.

Master Plan Subcommittee Report by Michele Keller, Chairperson:

• Michele's Keller informed all that the Master Plan Committee is meeting on October 8, 2018, via conference call to discuss the harms and risks related to CBA. She also stated that many

comments expressed concerns about night flights and environmental impact. We should explore the possibility getting studies funded by the JFK Redevelopment Plan.

- Brainstorming: JFK Airport Committee members, and later the public present, were asked to make suggestions of mitigations, givebacks that the CBA can pursue.
 - Connor Dunleavy-What is the scope of CBA? It is open to all communities covered in JFK
 AC.
 - Jim Heyliger that though scope in inclusive, it should be more focused on southeast
 Queens.
 - Peter Granikas suggested parking signs at the terminals and around airport grounds that make sense. Cited examples of signs in terminal area that are confusing.
 - o Philipa Karteron stated that the documents are available to read regarding the CBA.
 - Dawn Roberts-Semple suggested that we should incorporate some of the health studies from the LAX CBA, including the study of airports and their health effects on the lower respiratory system.
 - Denis Graham raised the concern that Jamaica Hospital is the only hospital that serves JFK. If someone is suffering a health emergency, the only way to get to the hospital is on the Van Wyck Expressway Service Road. He pointed out how congested this is, especially during peak commuter' hours. Health services needs to be looked at for JFK.
 - Dan Mundy what air and water quality resources will be available. Also, educational programs for children.
 - Connor Dunleavy he has observed that almost everything deals with Queens County.
 He would want a study done on the health effects of constant aircraft noise on the residents of Nassau County.
 - David ?(missed last name) JFK transportation studies, to include parking, and waiting areas.
 - (Public Input) question raised if there is any coordination of groups attempting to formulate CBA for the JFK redevelopment. Congressman Meeks is hosting a conference in attempts to do this.
 - Josie from St. Albans suggested that youth programs should be incorporated in CBA.
 Perhaps internships to encourage young people to get involved in the airline, aircraft and airport industries.

Public Comment Period:

• All comments had been made during brainstorming session.

Adjournment:

- Tom Curry congratulated Dan Mundy on providing the first motion that could be voted on in the history of the JFK AC.
- A motion was made to adjourn by Tom Curry and seconded by Connor Dunleavy. Motion passed.
