ExpressRail System

The Port Authority's three on-dock intermodal terminals - ExpressRail Elizabeth, ExpressRail Newark and ExpressRail Staten Island - handled 377,827 containers in 2008; an increase of nearly 20,000 units over 2007 and a new rail record for the Port of New York & New Jersey.

Watch for new rail improvements to come online in 2009 that will increase capacity and service for the Port's intermodal customers.
