Thank you for letting me know. I have pasted my request below, and I am also faxing it to you. In brief, am looking for copies of regulations, policies, or procedures that govern picketing, leafleting, expression activities, soliciting, display of newspapers, and commercial speech activities for the following airports: JLK, LaGuardia, and Newark. If materials are available online I can obtain them from the internet, but many airports have other policy documents that are not available and must be obtained from the airport.

Dear Records Administrator:

I am submitting this public records request to obtain materials for a study that I am conducting for the Airports Cooperative Research Program, a division of the National Academies. I will be studying and referencing the materials that I am requesting from you for a future research publication that will be available to airports for their assistance. This study is examining the regulation of First Amendment practices at airports (activities such as protesting, picketing, soliciting, etc.). I am already researching materials for your location that may be available online, such as state codes or any available city ordinances. However, some materials for your location may not be available online, and I do not know what materials you may have that apply to your airport.

I am making this request to obtain copies of any materials that currently govern First Amendment practices at your airport if those materials are not otherwise available online. These requested materials might include ordinances, policies, rules, and similar legal regulations, and they might regulate activities such as the following:

Rules that are applicable at the airport that govern soliciting, protesting, demonstrating, picketing, placing handbills, or other similar activities when they occur at the airport.

The airport administration's requirements for issuing "speech" related permits or consents, and for withdrawing that permission and handling disputes.

Rules governing employee- or labor-related speech or political speech that are applicable at the airport.

Rules governing religious expression or free association that are applicable at the airport.

Rules governing newsracks placed at the airport.

Rules governing advertising placed at the airport.

Rules that specify requirements for how commercial vendors may communicate with the public at the airport, such as requirements regarding how car rental fees may be stated, or restrictions on the ability of ground transportation companies to solicit business.

I would be happy to talk with you regarding what materials may be applicable to your airport and responsive to this request. I want to be sure that I have obtained the correct materials from your agency so I can properly include your airport as a part of this national research study. 


Dear Ms. Howick:
