

# MWSBE SPEND BY PROCUREMENT CATEGORY




■ Construction

# MWSBE SPEND BY SOURCE

The MWSBE spend of nearly \$436 million was from three sources:

- PA prime and sub-contracts: \$247 million
- WTC construction projects: \$130 million
- Aviation tenants: \$59 million

# REGIONAL ECONOMIC IMPACT OF MWSBE SPEND

The regional economic impact of the \$436 million in MWSBE spend:

- 3,572 job-years
- \$220 million in wages
- \$748 million in economic activity

# ADDITIONAL MWSBE AND DBE ACTIVITY FROM WTC TENANTS AND NEW PARTNERS

- Additional MWSBE and DBE activity from WTC tenants and partners from the Goethals Bridge Modernization Program and the George Washington Bridge Bus Station yielded a total of \$114.5 million in awards
- The \$114.5 million in MWSBE and DBE activity when added to our MWSBE spend of \$436 million totaled \$550.5 million

# CAPACITY BUILDING PROGRAMS

- In 2014: 15 MWSBEs participated in the core Mentor-Protégé Program
- 66 MWSBEs have participated in the core program since its inception in 2002
- Three protégés were awarded three Port Authority prime contracts totaling approximately \$2.1 million
- Seven protégés were awarded 13 subcontracts totaling \$6.4 million, which included work on some of the Port Authority's major capital projects

# CAPACITY BUILDING PROGRAMS

- Through our contract with the Regional Alliance for Small Contractors, over 25 construction management, OSHA safety, technical and business software courses were offered
- Nearly 560 MWSBE representatives attended these courses

# PRE-APPRENTICESHIP TRAINING PROGRAMS

- Edward J. Malloy Initiative for Construction Skills
  - 162 participants
- Newark Construction Careers Program
  - 51 participants
- Urban League of Hudson County, Inc., Civil Construction Worker Training and Entrepreneurial Development Center
  - 140 participants

Since 2001, over 2,330 New York and New Jersey graduates of these programs have been trained and placed, many into union apprenticeships programs

# MWSBE OUTREACH HIGHLIGHTS

- Co-sponsored and/or participated in a wide range of MWSBE networking events in New York and New Jersey, which attracted some 6,000 attendees
- Collaborated with McGraw Hill Construction / ENR for the first time, to present the “Building Connections and Creating Opportunities Conference” focusing on an MWSDBE audience

# INTEGRITY MONITORING

Maintaining the integrity of our MWSDBE programs has always been of utmost importance. Consistent with this objective:

- our Office of Inspector General (OIG) has been instrumental in the prosecution of firms that have tried to circumvent the integrity of our programs
- our review of MWSBE applications has continued to be diligent despite a large increase in certification requests due to major capital investments in the region
